HB 0119	Relating to Sexual Offenders and Predators	Glorioso
	Sexual Offenders and Predators: Prohibits loitering or prowling by certain offenders within specified distance of places where children were congregating; prohibits certain actions toward child at public park or playground by certain offenders; prohibits presence of certain offenders at child care facility or pre- K through 12 school without notice & supervision; provides exceptions; provides penalties, etc. Effective Date: upon becoming a law Current Committee of Reference: No Current Committee 4/15/2010 SENATE In Messages	
HB 0225	Relating to Controlled Substances	Legg
	Controlled Substances: Requires AHCA to contract with multistate electronic prescribing network to provide certain agencies with access to certain controlled substance information; revises requirements for registration of pain-management clinics; requires DOH to refuse to register pain-management clinics under certain circumstances; specifies additional grounds for disciplinary action against certain licensed practitioners & community pharmacy permittees; requires community pharmacy permit applicants & controlled substance dispensing practitioners to demonstrate ability to participate in & transmit dispensing information through multistate electronic prescribing network; requires community pharmacy permittees & controlled substance dispensing practitioners to transmit dispensing information through such network for prescriptions of certain controlled substances; requires controlled substance dispensing practitioners to register with Board of Pharmacy & pay fees; requires DOH to request certain persons to submit statements of reference concerning practitioners seeking such registrations; provides for contents of & procedures for submitting such statements; limits civil liability of persons submitting such statements to DOH; prohibits DOH from registering certain practitioners; provides procedures for administrative challenges to denials of registrations & registration renewals. HB 0325	Relating to Uniform Traffic Control	Reagan
	Uniform Traffic Control: Creates Mark Wandall Traffic Safety Program; preempts to state use of cameras to enforce traffic laws; provides for DHSMV or any county or municipality to use traffic infraction detector to identify motor vehicle that fails to stop at traffic control signal steady red light; increases certain fines & provides for distribution of fine proceeds; provides that no points may be assessed against driver's license for infractions enforced by traffic infraction enforcement officer. HB 0417	Relating to Collective Bargaining	Hays
	Collective Bargaining: Redefines term "legislative body" for purposes of collective bargaining impasses with respect to employees of certain county constitutional officers; requires board of county commissioners to provide supplemental funds to such county constitutional officers under certain circumstances; provides that resolution of certain impasses is binding on all parties; specifies parties required to approve certain collective bargaining agreements. SB 0448	Relating to Wireless Communications Device/Driving	Detert
	Wireless Communications Device/Driving [CPSC]: Creates the "Florida Ban on Texting While Driving Law." Prohibits the operation of a motor vehicle while using a wireless communications device for certain purposes. Provides for points to be assessed against a driver's license for the unlawful use of a wireless communications device resulting in a crash, etc. EFFECTIVE DATE: 10/01/2010. HB 1235	Relating to Enforcement of Traffic Laws	Schenck
	Enforcement of Traffic Laws: Prohibits use of traffic infraction detectors & cameras by county or municipality to enforce traffic laws unless expressly authorized by general law; preempts to state authority to use traffic infraction detectors to enforce traffic laws. SB 1284	Relating to Sexual Offenders and Predators	Aronberg
	Sexual Offenders and Predators [SPSC]: Enhances the penalty for loitering or prowling by certain offenders within a specified distance of certain places where children congregate. Preempts certain local ordinances relating to residency limitations for sexual predators and offenders and provides for repeal of such ordinances. Revises provisions relating to address and residence reporting requirements for sexual offenders adjudicated delinquent, etc. EFFECTIVE DATE: Upon becoming law. HB 1393	Relating to Broward County	Porth
	Broward County: Creates Broward Independent Fire District; provides boundaries; provides for board; provides district powers & duties, including financial powers & procedures; provides power to impose impact fees, special assessments, user fees, & ad valorem taxes; provides ballot statement; requires referendum. Effective Date: upon approval by a majority vote of those qualified electors of Broward County voting in a referendum to be called by the Broward County Supervisor of Elections on November 2, 2010, except that this section and section 14 shall take effect upon this act becoming a law Current Committee of Reference: Military & Local Affairs Policy Committee

- HB 1511** **Relating to Effective Public Notices by Governmental Entities** Workman
Effective Public Notices by Governmental Entities: Authorizes local government to use its publicly accessible website for legally required notices & advertisements; defines "publicly accessible website"; provides conditions for utilization of publicly accessible website for such purposes; provides for optional receipt of legally required public notices & advertisements via first class mail or e-mail; provides requirements for legally required advertisements & public notices published on publicly accessible website; provides that specified notice, advertisement, or publication on publicly accessible website constitutes legal notice; provides that advertisements directed by law or order or decree of court to be made in county in which no newspaper is published may be made by publication on publicly accessible website; provides clarifying & conforming language. Effective Date: October 1, 2010

- SB 2166** **Relating to Uniform Traffic Control** Altman
Uniform Traffic Control [WPSC]; Preempts to the state the use of cameras to enforce traffic laws. Clarifies the inapplicability of ch. 493, F.S., to laws governing the use of cameras as provided by the act. Authorizes a county or municipality to use traffic infraction detectors. Creates the Mark Wandall Traffic Safety Program. Provides for the placement and installation of detectors on certain roads, etc. EFFECTIVE DATE: 07/01/2010.

- SB 2272** **Relating to Controlled Substances** Fasano
Controlled Substances [SPSC]; (THIS BILL COMBINES CS/S2272 & CS/S2722) Provides that pain-management clinics that are required to be registered with the DOH are business establishments. Requires all privately owned pain-management clinics, or offices that primarily engage in the treatment of pain by prescribing or dispensing controlled substance medications or by employing a physician who is primarily engaged in the same, to register with the DOH, etc. EFFECTIVE DATE: 10/01/2010.
