EARTH DAY AT CITY'S LAKESIDE SAND PINE NATURE PRESERVE

City Commissioner John Adornato attended the City's Earth Day event and read the Earth Day Proclamation. Afterwards, City horticulturist Charles Livio conducted a tour of the Sand Pine Nature Preserve trails. He explained the geology and unique flora & fauna found in the preserve. Earth Day volunteers collected trash along the trails and also around the pavilion and parking areas. Three native beauty berry shrubs were planted. The flowers of these shrubs are a favorite source of nectar for butterflies and the berries provide food for birds. The Earth Day volunteers also planted three species of native wildflower seed (blanket flower, Coreopsis and goldenrod) in the parking circle area. Some of the seeds were donated and some collected at the preserve. Sand pine needles from the preserve were collected and used to lightly cover the seeds. We look forward to their germination to enhance the entry at the preserve.

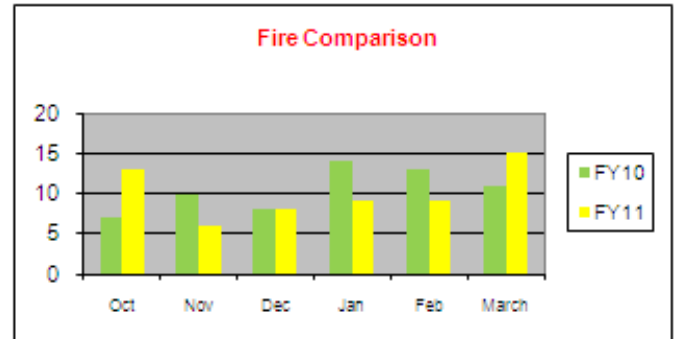
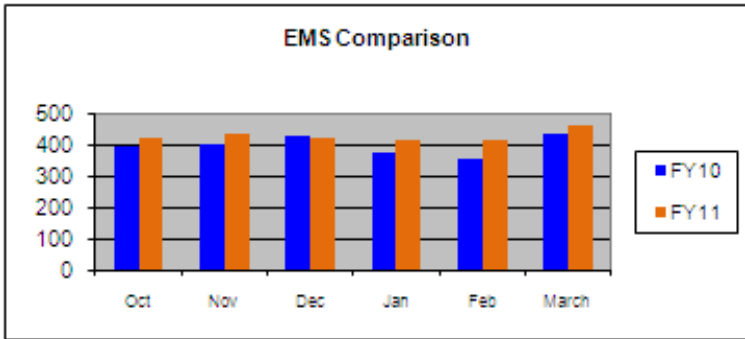

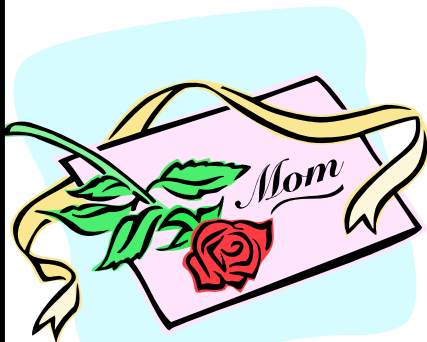

City of Fort Lauderdale to Chlorinate Water System
Preventive Water System Maintenance Scheduled for April 30 – May 21

Fort Lauderdale – The City of Fort Lauderdale will temporarily return to using free chlorine in its drinking water system. This preventive maintenance procedure will begin at 9 a.m. Saturday, April 30, 2011 and will end at 9 a.m. Saturday, May 21, 2011.

Free chlorination is a common practice for water systems using combined chlorine disinfection. The chlorination period is anticipated to be transparent to our customers; however, some may notice a slight change in the taste or smell of their tap water.

This procedure will affect the City of Fort Lauderdale, as well as Lauderdale-by-the-Sea, **Oakland Park**, Port Everglades Authority, Village of Sea Ranch Lakes, Wilton Manors and sections of Davie and Tamarac.

The City of Fort Lauderdale maintains the highest standards to ensure that clean high quality drinking water is delivered to water customers. The City's drinking water meets federal, state and local drinking water quality standards.

Property Tax Exemption Filing Dates Announced For May 2011

The Broward County Property Appraiser's Office hosts a series of community outreach events each month throughout Broward County. Deputy Appraisers will be available to assist with Homestead, Senior and other property tax exemption applications, as well as answer questions on property taxes. We are also accepting applications for Portability. The outreach program is designed to provide convenient and accessible service to the residents of Broward County. All outreach events listed below are open to the public.

Documents required to file a Homestead Exemption include:

- A current Florida driver's license or Florida identification card, and
- A current voter registration card or declaration of domicile
- Non-US citizens must also provide proof of permanent residency.

Qualified residents 65 years of age or older as of January 1, 2011 may also apply for the additional Senior Exemption. Eligible seniors must have a total household adjusted gross income not to exceed \$26,203. Documents required for the Senior Exemption include a 2010 income tax return or, if one does not file income taxes, a copy of the 2010 Social Security 1099 Form.

You still have time to file if you forgot to file for a 2011 Homestead Exemption, Widow/Widower Exemption, Disability Exemption, Portability, or other exemption. Simply contact us to complete your application by the September 19, 2011 deadline.

Landscape Irrigation Restrictions

For Broward, Glades, Hendry, Martin, Miami-Dade, Monroe, Okeechobee, Palm Beach and St. Lucie counties. Also for portions of Osceola County within the SFWMD boundaries, the Town of Windermere in Orange County and cities within Lee County except Cape Coral.

- Landscape irrigation using reclaimed water is not restricted.

Existing landscaping

- Watering is not allowed between 10 a.m. and 4 p.m.
- Residents and businesses with **odd**-numbered street addresses may water lawns and landscapes on **Wednesdays** and **Saturdays** from 12 a.m. to 10 a.m. and/or from 4 p.m. to 11:59 p.m.
- Residents and businesses with **even**-numbered street addresses, no street address or irrigate both even and odd address within the same zones, including multi-family units and homeowners associations, may water lawns and landscapes on **Thursdays** and **Sundays** from 12 a.m. to 10 a.m. and/or from 4 p.m. to 11:59 p.m.
- For the most efficient use of water, residents should avoid irrigating during both time periods on the same day.

New landscaping, sod or other plantings

- New landscaping can be watered without regard to restrictions on the first day it is installed.
- Landscaping that has been in place from **2 days to 30 days** can be watered on **Mondays, Tuesdays, Wednesdays, Thursdays, Saturdays and/or Sundays** during the hours allowed for regular landscape irrigation.
- Landscaping that has been in place from **31 days to 90 days** can be watered on **Mondays, Wednesdays, Thursdays and Saturdays** during the hours allowed for regular landscape irrigation.
- Additional watering days can only be used to benefit new landscaping. An entire irrigation system zone may only be watered if it contains at least 50 percent new landscaping.

Applying lawn maintenance products

- Landscape irrigation for watering-in fertilizers, insecticides, pesticides, fungicides and herbicides is allowed for one application unless the need for more than one application is stated in the directions specified by the product manufacturer.

- Watering-in is allowed only during established watering days and times unless a professional licensed applicator has posted a temporary sign with the date of the application and the date of needed watering-in.

Frequently Asked Questions

- Restrictions apply to all sources of water for irrigation including wells, canals, ponds and lakes.
- Using a watering can or hand-watering with a hose and attached adjustable spray or trigger nozzle is allowed.
- Drip, bubble and micro-jet systems that apply water directly to root plant zones may be used anytime. Any low-volume system should not produce water runoff.
- Landscape irrigation systems may be operated once a week during restricted days and/or times for cleaning, maintenance and repair if an attendant is on site in the area being tested. Testing should not exceed 10 minutes per zone.
- Car, boat and other vehicle washing is allowed. Always attach an adjustable spray or trigger nozzle to the hose and wash vehicles over a non-paved, grassy or porous area.
- Residential and commercial water restrictions are mandatory and are enforced by South Florida Water Management District staff, local governments and law enforcement agencies. Residential fines vary by municipality, but typically range from \$25 to \$125 for a first offense. Civil penalties for violations of restrictions by District permittees and commercial users begin at \$1,500 and can increase depending on the severity of the violation.
- Violations of water restrictions may be reported to local law enforcement or city/county zoning and code enforcement agencies. Both have the authority to issue warnings and citations that can lead to fines. If you choose to notify your local law enforcement agency, please call their non-emergency number.
- Variances from restrictions that may allow you to change your watering days and/or times can be applied for through the South Florida Water Management District. The application form and instructions are online at: www.sfwmd.gov/waterwatch. Applications will be reviewed by South Florida Water Management District staff, and approval or denial is based on criteria listed in the Water Shortage Plan Rule. Water restrictions must be observed while a variance application is under consideration. For more information call (800) 432-2045.

Prescription Discount Cards Still Proving Helpful to Broward Residents

Broward County residents who used Prescription Drug Discount Cards offered by the County's Community Partnerships Division saved nearly \$600,000 over the retail cost of prescription medications in 2010. The card was used by an average of nearly 1,400 Broward County residents each month and presented more than 16,000 times (based on multiple prescription orders).



NACo Prescription Discount Card

In partnership with the National Association of Counties (NACo), Broward County Human Services Department launched the free discount card program in May 2007 to help consumers cope with the high price of prescription drugs.

The cards may be used by all County residents, regardless of age, income or existing health coverage, at any of the more than 60,000 participating retail pharmacies, including most large chain pharmacies and many independent pharmacies. Cardholders can also save on pet prescriptions that are used to treat similar human conditions, at participating retail pharmacies.

Since its inception in 2004, on a national level, NACo reports that consumers have saved more than \$355 million with the card. At least 1,370 counties in all 50 states, the District of Columbia and U.S. Territories are making the free money-saving cards available to residents. The national average savings per prescription filled is 24 percent.

Cards are free and can be picked up at many Broward County government facilities, including parks, libraries, transit facilities, the downtown Governmental Center and the County's four Family Success Centers.
